(Under sections 38, 40 and 80 (1) of the Local Governments Act, Cap 243)

An Ordinance to raise revenue by fees and licences on specified businesses and activities; the method of collection; and for other related matters.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the district of the Wakiso as follows:

PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. Citation

This ordinance may be cited as the Local Governments (Wakiso District Revenue) ordinance, 2010.

2. Application

This ordinance shall apply to the following areas of Wakiso District—

(I) SUB-COUNTIES

- (a) Makindye
- (b) Nabweru
- (c) Gombe
- (d) Nangabo
- (e) Busukuma
- (f) Wakiso
- (g) Katabi
- (h) Nsangi
- (i) Ssisa
- (j) Kasanje
- (k) Kakiri
- (l) Namayumba
- (m) Masuliita

(II) TOWN COUNCILS

- (a) Kira
- (b) Nansana
- (c) Wakiso
- (d) Kakiri

3. Interpretation

In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Agent” includes a private tenderer appointed by the Council;

“Chief Administrative officer” means the Chief Administrative Officer of Wakiso District;

“Council” means Wakiso District Council;

“Currency point” is equivalent to twenty thousand Uganda Shillings;

“Person” includes any corporate body or firm;

“Town clerk” means any Town Clerk or Assistant Town clerk for any area in Wakiso District.

PART II—LICENCES

4. Licensing

A person shall not operate any of the businesses or carry out any activity specified in the First Schedule, unless he or she has a licence issued by the Council.

5. Licensing fees

The licence fee payable for each business or activity shall be as prescribed in the First Schedule.

PART III—OPERATION FEES

6. Levy on operations

There shall be a levy on the operators of the businesses and activities specified in the Second Schedule, to be known as operation fee.

7. Scale of levies

The rates of the fees shall be as specified in the Second Schedule and the Council or its agent shall on receiving payment forthwith issue a receipt to the payer.

PART III—MARKETS, LANDING SITES AND ABATTOIR DUES

8. Dues

Markets, landing sites and abattoirs dues shall be levied on the various activities and commodities as specified in the Third Schedule.

9. Liability for payment

Payments of the respective dues shall be the responsibility of the person carrying out the specified business.

10. Receipt

The Council or its agent shall forthwith issue a receipt for any payment of market dues.

11. Dues for mubuulo markets

The dues for mubuulo markets shall be payable for each day the market operates.

12. Dues for fish landing sites and abattoirs

The dues for fish landing sites and abattoirs shall be paid for transaction as specified.

13. Dues for daily markets

The dues for daily markets shall be payable monthly.

14. Dues on bulk deliveries

Wholesalers bringing in foodstuffs and other items in bulk shall be charged once and for all fee for each delivery.

PART IV—BUILDING PLAN FEES

15. Approval of building plans

A person shall not erect any building or other structure unless he or she has approved plans as provided for under the Physical Planning Act, 2010.

16. Scale of fees

The fees payable in respect of building plans and approvals shall be as specified in the Third Schedule.

PART V—MISCELLANEOUS

17. Refusal and revocation

(1) The council may refuse to grant or revoke a licence or receipt for any business or activity whose operations are contrary to any Laws of Uganda, planning requirements or environmental safety.

(2) A person aggrieved by the refusal to grant a licence, revocation of a licence or receipt, may appeal to the Chief Administrative Officer or, to a Town Clerk.

18. Compliance with other laws

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed so as to entitle the holder of any operation permit, licence or receipt granted to carry on any business or activity for which a specific licence, permit or receipt is required by any written Law for the time being in force.

19. Non assignment of licence or receipt

A licence or receipt issued, shall not be lent, transferred or assigned to any other person or entity.

20. Production of licence or receipt for inspection

A person carrying on any business or activity prescribed in any Schedule shall, on being so required by an officer or agent of the Council, produce his or her licence or receipt for inspection.

21. Duplicate licence or receipt

Where the Council is satisfied that any licence or receipt issued has been lost or destroyed or obliterated, it may issue a duplicate licence or receipt upon payment of a surcharge of fifty percent of the original fee.

22. Appointment of agents

The Council shall from time to time appoint agents to issue licences and receipts on its behalf.

23. Assessment of revenue categories

The assessment of the revenue category and its amount shall be carried out by the chief of the locality.

24. Appeal against assessment

A person aggrieved by a decision of the chief of the locality may appeal to the Chief Administrative Officer or, if in a town, to the Town Clerk, within fourteen days from the date of communication of the decision.

25. Validity of licence

Unless otherwise stated in a schedule, a licence or operation fee shall be valid for the calendar year in which it is issued.

PART VI—OFFENCES

26. Offences

A person who—

- (a) contravenes any provision of this Ordinance; or
- (b) obstructs or hinders, or knowingly makes a false statement to any officer or agent of the Council in the performance of his or her functions,

commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two currency points or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding six months or both.
